

VIRGINIA: IN THE CIRCUIT COURT FOR THE CITY OF WINCHESTER

AMENDED 2022 JOINT JUDICIAL CENTER COVID RESTRICTION ORDER

It appearing to the Court that the dangers due to the Novel Coronavirus COVID-19 are ongoing,

It is ADJUDGED, ORDERED, and DECREED effective January 1, 2022 and through December 31, 2022, that:

1. The Clerk of this Court shall post a sign in English and Spanish at both public entrances of the Joint Judicial Center (JJC) advising the public that individuals must submit to the following inquiry before entering the JJC:

Have you, within the previous 14 days:


1. traveled internationally;
 2. been directed to quarantine, isolate, or self-monitor;
 3. been diagnosed with, or have had contact with anyone who has been diagnosed with COVID-19; or have you personally experienced or had contact with anyone who has the following symptoms that cannot be attributed to another health condition: fever or chills, cough, shortness of breath, difficulty breathing (other than a pre-existing non-COVID diagnosis), fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting, diarrhea; or
 4. resided with or been in close contact with any person in the above-mentioned categories.
 5. Have you been tested for COVID-19 and are waiting to receive test results?
2. For all persons entering the JJC through its public entrances, the Winchester City Sheriff or his deputy shall: a) make inquiry by pointing to the described sign and asking, "do you meet 1, 2, 3, 4, or 5?"; and b) take the temperature of such persons via a no-touch infrared thermometer.
 3. If an individual either: a) responds that they do meet 1, 2, 3, 4, or 5; or b) registers a temperature of 100.4 F or greater; or c) refuses to respond to the inquiry or refuses to have their temperature taken; they are prohibited from entering the JJC (except as provided in paragraph 4) and must contact the office of the clerk of the court they were to attend by telephone or other remote means

to inform the clerk of their business before the court so they may receive further instruction regarding alternate arrangements for court access.

4. If an individual responds that they meet 2, 3, 4, or 5 of the questions posed in paragraph 1, they may nonetheless enter the JJC if they have isolated for the requisite time per the then current Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) guidelines.

This order supersedes and replaces the Court's 2022 Joint Judicial Center Covid Restriction Order entered January 4, 2022. The Clerk is directed to post a copy of this order and to distribute it to the members of the Winchester-Frederick County Bar.
